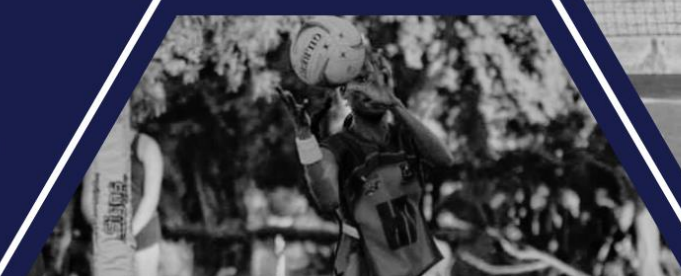

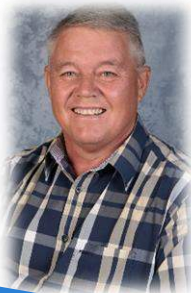

# School uniform for Liggie

Parents are requested to purchase the prescribed school uniform at the school's Bookshop. It brings uniformity that is essential to the school. All new Grade 8 learners will be receiving a free school blazer from the school. Parents will find that quality is taken into account and that the best value is obtained at the Bookshop. **Please come and fit a blazer and support clothes as soon as possible at the Bookshop,** so that the correct sizes can be ordered for your child. There is a clothes bank at the school where second-hand clothes are available.

## GIRLS' SUMMER DRESS

1. SKIRT AND BLOUSE: school skirt and short-sleeved light blue blouse.
2. SHOES: black standard school shoes with a flat heel and straps.
3. SOCKS: prescribed navy short socks with stripe.
4. JERSEY: prescribed only blue, sleeveless pullover / long sleeve jersey.
5. SCHOOL BLAZER: prescribed school blazer.
6. JEWELRY: ordinary wristwatches only; silver or gold earrings (standard size and one per earlobe) are allowed. Note: no pebbles. Signet rings may be worn.
7. HAIR: must be neat.

## BOYS' SUMMER DRESS

1. SHIRT: blue, short-sleeved shirt for school uniform.
2. TROUSERS: grey trousers/shorts.
3. TIE: prescribed school tie.
4. SOCKS: grey long socks.
5. SHOES: black standard school shoes with laces
6. JERSEY: prescribed, blue long-sleeved or sleeveless pullover.

# TECHNOLOGY

## LIGGIE TECHNOLOGY

Here at Ligbron, we realise that modern technology, such as cell phones and smartwatches, is part of the learners' and parents' world of communication. Having cell phones (or smartwatches) at school as such is not against the school rules, so there are some important rules that everyone should be aware of and observe:

### Cell phone

Cell phones must be turned off at all times during school hours, except when the teacher permits them for work in class, or for use during breaks in the SS.

If your child needs to make an urgent call, he/she can go to Reception, where he/she will be assisted.

Learners are responsible for their cell phones at all times. Cell phones should never be left in places where they can be removed or stolen. A cell phone should preferably not be left in sports bags or school bags on the premises.

We invariably suggest the responsible and judicious use of technology and consider it very important for learners to also learn what the right etiquette is regarding its use. Learners who are guilty of the indiscriminate use of technology will receive penalties according to the school's code of conduct. If technology is used during tests, examinations or assessment tasks, action will be taken in accordance with the school's code of conduct and the examination rules.

# TO LEAVE THE SCHOOL GROUND

## TO LEAVE THE SCHOOL GROUND

Liggies try to never arrange any appointments during school hours, but we understand that it is sometimes impossible to get appointments outside of school hours. A learner may only leave the school grounds with the permission of the parent. Even when parents pick up a learner at school for an appointment or an emergency, the learner must be signed out at Reception. Learners may only leave the school grounds through the main gate, after checking out at the office. If a learner has to leave the school grounds during school hours, the following procedure must be followed:

You arrange in advance by written notification (letter) or send an e-mail ([reception@ligbron.co.za](mailto:reception@ligbron.co.za)) that you will pick up your child. The letter should, where possible, indicate the exact time at which the learner will be picked up, as well as who (name and telephone number) will pick up your child if you cannot do so yourself.

Your child then needs to show the letter (at the beginning of the relevant subject period in which he/she has to leave the class) to the subject teacher and inform the teacher at what time he/she will leave the class. Your child will then wait for you at Reception in the administration building where you will sign him/her out. You will receive a note which you hand in at the gate before leaving the school grounds.

No learner can be called out of class during a period. Therefore, if you have not arranged in advance, you will have to wait until the period is over.

If your child becomes ill at school, he/she must report to the office. We will call you if you have to pick him/her up and he/she will be waiting for you at Reception.

We appeal to you to respect school hours and help us teach your child what work pride means.

## School History

In the early 1940's the Dutch Reformed Church and the Rev. N.J. Veltman realized that young people needed to be trained in commerce. Discussions to start evening classes failed, and there was no assistance from the then Department of Education. In 1958 the "Reddingsdaadbond" offered financial help and two commercial schools were started, one in Johannesburg and one in Ermelo. The very first educator was Mr. J.H. Kotze. Mr. Koot Kruger was the first Principal of both these schools. In 1954 Mr. P.J. Heyl became the first full-time principal. The school became a registered State School in 1956.

The commercial school was first housed in the Dutch Reformed Church hall called the Johanna-hall. When this hall was demolished the foundation stone was cemented into the present school building, which was erected and officially inaugurated on 3 November 1961. The new school was called Albert Hertzog Commercial High School, named after Dr. Hertzog.

Mr. Heyl resigned on 29 September 1967. Mr. G.B. Jordaan became principal in January 1968. In the same year the then Transvaal Education Department became the school's national employer. A Technical study course was implemented in the school to manage the policy of differentiation. The school also celebrated its 25th year of existence.

At first, the subjects of Electrician work and Fitting- and Turning were introduced, then Motor Mechanics, Technical Electronical and Welding- and Metalworks followed in 1972. In 1973 the first pupils registered for a Technical course and in 1977 the school became a fully registered Technical school. Technicians who were so urgently needed in the country came to the school for training and the school name changed to High School Ligbron. Mr. G.B. Jordaan finally resigned after 19 years of duty. His successor was Mr. J.P. Smith in January 1988. During October of the same year, the school name once again changed to Technical High School Ligbron. Mr. C.J. Bester became his successor on 1 April 1992 - 1999. Mr. Dup. van Rensburg, Vice-principal at the time, became principal in July 2000. Under his visionary leadership, a shift in emphasis in the school's curriculum was implemented and the worldwide need for education in Technology is now being addressed. The school's name changed again to reflect this shift, and it is now called Ligbron Academy of Technology. Mr Gerhard Brand became principal in 2020 and the Ligbron of today is a unique school with two complete study fields: academic as well as technical subjects.

## The School Badge and Motto

The meanings of the different symbols are:

**GEAR:** Co-operation in the field of industry

**SPADE:** Labor, especially farming.

**SCALE:** Industry

**LAMP:** Lamp of knowledge that lights the gear, scale and spade
